



## FRESH FOOTPRINT **Open Layout**

Three shrewd modifications removing most upper cabinets, relocating the sink, and replacing a pair of small windows with a single extra-wide one above the new sink—aired out the closed-in space. Alison also moved the refrigerator into a former closet outside the kitchen.

# Bistro Backsplash

Four-inch-square white ceramic tiles with contrasting dark grout set the bistro-style scene. The glass-front—and backless!—upper cabinets showcase the backsplash, as well as pretty dishware. An understated range hood coated with a limewash paint (Solaris by Portola Paints) mimics the softness of plaster.

## 3 EASY UPGRADE **Backplated** Hardware

Alison was drawn to the solid construction and antique brass finish of the British artisanmade cabinet handles, which lend texture to the modest Shaker-style drawer fronts. To get the substantial look without replacing your hardware, add a backplate (rejuvenation.com) to your existing handles.

### CHARACTER BUILDER **Statement Island**

Alison teamed up with Unique Kitchens and Baths cabinet designer Tanya Smith-Shiflett to build an ultra-functional island, which stores the microwave, small appliances, and cookware. The inset panels and striking blue hue (for similar, try Endless Sea by Sherwin-Williams) give the island a furniture-like feel, as does the polished marble top with a delicate ogee edge.

# **Bentwood Stools**

The black counter stools are a nod to the styles seen at French cafés. The graceful and enduring shape was perfected in the 1830s when German-Austrian cabinetmaker Michael Thonet developed a novel approach to furniture design, using steam to bend pieces of wood.
